The Silk Road Economic Belt and the 21st Century Maritime Silk Road initiative, proposed by China, will push trade and investment between China and countries along the routes and their common development.

More than 60 countries along the routes and international organizations have shown interest in taking part in the development of the Belt and the Road.

The Silk Road Fund was launched.

Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank (AIIB) was proposed by China in 2013 and launched at a ceremony in Beijing in October 2014. A total of 57 countries have applied to be founding members of the AIIB, including major powers such as Britain, Germany, South Korea and Russia. AIIB is to be fully established by the end of 2015.

Trade volume between China and the Belt and Road countries is to surpass \$ 2.5 trillion in a decade

The Chinese economy has entered a state of new normal, which brings more opportunities of trade, growth, investment and cooperation for other countries.

In the coming five years, China will import more than \$ 10 trillion of goods, Chinese investment abroad will exceed \$ 500 billion, and more than 500 million outbound visits will be made by Chinese tourists.
