Background

In January 1977, ie exactly 40 years ago, Charter 77, a petition coauthored by the playwright Václav Havel and signed by a group of courageous citizens in Czechoslovakia demanding the communist regime to implement human rights provisions of the Helsinki accords and other relevant documents was published. The regime retaliated by prosecuting and imprisoning the signatories.

Charter 77 Foundation was established in Sweden in 1978, to support the prosecuted. Václav Havel led the nation to freedom in the Velvet Revolution in 1989: the dissident, whose demand was "living in truth", became a president, whose official motto is "Truth prevails".

The Charter 77 inspired many similar movements worldwide, from China to Belarus. But are the ideas of Charter 77 still valid today, when polls show that young Europeans don't value freedom and democracy as their parents did, and when some experts label our times as post-truth era?
