



NATO and the Security of Europe after the Brussels Summit

The Trans-Atlantic Security in light of the NATO Special Meeting of 25 May 2017

Vienna, 21 June, 2017

The NATO Heads of State and Government met in Brussels on 25 May. Taking place in the new NATO Headquarters, with the new US president Donald Trump at the table, the event marked a symbolic milestone. But more than that: At a time when the European security is being challenged in a very complex and intense manner, reaffirming the vitality of the transatlantic bond, including the full commitment to the collective defence is of crucial importance to European Allies and European continent as a whole. The Allies took important decisions to do more in the fight against terrorism and to ensure fairer burden sharing across NATO.

On 21 June, the NATO Contact Point Embassy in Vienna and the Austrian Defence Academy organize a debate on the outcome of the summit and its implications for the security of Europe, with a particular focus on Austria.
