

INTERNATIONAL DEFENCE-INDUSTRIAL COOPERATION



- Identification of opportunities for the Czech defence industry.
- Bringing Czech defence industry with political delegations abroad.
- Organization of visits of partner MoDs to the Czech Republic.
- Official endorsement on political level and guarantees through G2G model.
- Organization of Czech Defence Industry days, Industrial fora etc.
- Anchoring industrial cooperation through memoranda of understanding.

CHALLENGES FOR 2019 AND BEYOND



- Maximalization of domestic DefInd participation on the planned major acquisition projects (IFV, utility helicopters, MADR radar system)
- Participation of Czech companies in the European Defence Fund (EDF) consortia
- The PROPED framework
- Improving competitiveness, R&D, ensuring security of supplies for the Army of the Czech Republic

ARMAMENTS AND DEFENCE INDUSTRY DEVELOPMENT SUPPORT STRATEGY



- Approved by the government in 12/2016, introduced in 2017
- Linked to the national Defence Strategy, Security Strategy and Czech Armed Forces Development Concept 2025
- Defines the vision, principles and strategic goals to develop armament and defence-industrial support policy
- Focused on developing a functional and effective security of supplies system

SOUTH AND EAST APPROACH



 South and East Approach = Direct export efforts, or collaboration with partners to penetrate third markets

 An example of cooperation with Israel to breach the Indian market

NORTH AND WEST APPROACH



The direct increase in the volume of supplies is rather exceptional

Key support of technological development of Czech companies

Promoting involvement in the production, research and development of Western societies and subcontracting chains

THE PROPED FRAMEWORK



- Exhibitions, Industry Days (MPO, CzechTrade)
- Receptions and Armed Forces' Days (DAO)
- Incoming missions for both private sector and Armed Forces
- Bilateral meetings (G2G and mediation of B2B)
