




Czech Aid in Cambodia






Czech Aid in Bosnia and Herzegovina

- Access to drinking water and wastewater management
- Circular economy, waste treatment
- Strengthening transparent and accountable institutions

One of the largest projects is the expansion and reconstruction of the drinking water treatment plant in the municipality of Teslić. The project will ensure access to safe water for 38 thousand inhabitants. The supply of Czech technology will bring the city a modern drinking water treatment plant. The construction part of the project is financed through a loan from the European Investment Bank. The development of the capacities of the local municipal enterprise is provided by the United Nations Development Programme. Thanks to these partnerships, the Czech Republic can implement even the most demanding projects.








Czech Aid in Ethiopia

- Agriculture and rural development, with a focus on strengthening sustainable landscape management and climate resilience in areas affected by climate change, ensuring access to safe water, protecting biodiversity and promoting environmentally friendly agricultural practices.
- Inclusive social development reflecting Ethiopia's strategy for food security, quality health care, modern equitable and inclusive education, technical and vocational skills development and linking education to employment opportunities.
- **Good democratic governance** that meets Ethiopia's needs for enhanced governance and transparency in public administration and sustainable use and management of natural resources.

One of the landmark projects was the creation of geological and hydrogeological map of Ethiopia at a scale of 1:1 000 000. The compilation of geoscience data is essential for effective planning and appropriate allocation and management of natural resources in Ethiopia.

Aid to Ukraine after 24 February 2022 is an important part of Czech foreign policy


This assistance is currently being implemented under the Ukraine Programme with a budget of 500 mil. CZK per year and delivered in cooperation with several Czech ministries and through a number of diverse tools.



MEDEVAC Medical Humanitarian Missions and Improving the Quality of Equipment


