

Anna Magdalena Kokits was born 1988 in Vienna and received her first piano lessons at the age of four. Since the year 2000 she studies with Alejandro Geberovich, with whom she continues her studies at the Konservatorium Wien Privatuniversität. Anna Magdalena Kokits is award winner of various national and international competitions. Her first concert with orchestra took place in 2005 with the Tonkünstler-Orchester Niederösterreich in Vienna. She can regularly be heard in solo recitals and chamber music concerts domestically as well as abroad and was invited at the Festivals like the *International Brahmsfest Mürzzuschlag*, the

Klavierfrühling Deutschlandberg, the Festival Nei suoni dei luoghi in Italien, the Euregio Festival, the Musikfest Schloss Weinzierl as well as the Musikalischer Sommer in Ostfriesland. Amongst her chamber music partners are Eduard Brunner (clarinet), Herbert Kefer (viola) and the Bennewitz Quartet. As from 2007 she forms a duo with the Alexander Gebert, cellist of the Altenberg Trio, performing regularly at the Musikverein in Vienna as well as in numerous other European countries. In 2009 Anna Magdalena Kokits made her debut at the Konzerthaus in Vienna and in May 2011 she gave her first solo recital at the Musikverein Wien. Recently the pianist performed at the Festival Rising Stars in Kremlin with the Moscow Virtuosi under direction of Vladimir Spivakov. Together with Palestinian, French, American, Greek and Austrian musicians she also performed at the presentation of the new Al Quds University College of Music Project in Vienna in May 2011. Future engagements include concerts in Germany, Italy and Finland and the recording of her first piano solo CD.



Hiba Harhash was born 1989 in Jerusalem. She graduated from Jerusalem high school and started her education for ballet and contemporary dance at the YWCA and YMCA in Jerusalem and Beit Hanoar Jerusalem. She followed her studies in Italy where she also obtained a bachelor's degree in interior design. She regularly performs in Palestine and is member of the Sarreyet Ramallah Contemporary Dance Troupe. Recent engagements include performances in Thailand and her appearance in the show *From Dust* at the Ramallah Contemporary Dance Festival. Hiba Harhash is currently teaching contemporary dance and ballet at Sarreyet Ramallah and ballet at the Rosary Sister's School in Jerusalem as well as at the studio My First Gym in Ramallah. Future engagements include tours with Nawal Skandarani to Tunis, Italy and Jordan as well as another participation in the Palestinian contemporary dance festival in April 2013.
