The Joint Research Centre operates close to the policy-making process serving the common interest of the Member States, while being independent of special interests. Most posts will be in Seville (Spain), Petten (The Netherlands), Ispra (Italy), Geel (Belgium) and Karlsruhe (Germany).

To apply, you need a university degree of at least 4 years in a relevant scientific domain followed by at least 6 years' professional experience relevant to the duties, or a university degree of at least 3 years in a relevant scientific domain followed by at least 7 years' professional experience. Additionally, you must be an EU citizen and have a thorough knowledge of one of the 24 EU languages and a satisfactory knowledge of either English, French, German, Italian or Spanish.
