

### **3. Description of Problem, Suggested Intervention and List of Items**

Namibia is one of the least densely populated countries in Southern Africa. In general, access to health care is relatively good - most people live within a 10 km radius of a health facility. However, Namibia faces many challenges related to the provision of primary health care, because still many people live in remote rural areas where health facilities are rare and very distant. This isolation makes it difficult not only to access healthcare but also to ensure access to urgent health interventions.

One innovative way to improve Namibia's health care situation could be the introduction of mobile containers equipped with medical devices for primary care.

Mobile containers can easily be transported to rural regions where hospitals or clinics are not available. These units could serve as temporary clinics where patients could receive basic medical care and diagnostics. The containers should be equipped with diagnostic tools such as ultrasound machines, glucometers and laboratory equipment for rapid tests. This would enable the prompt identification of diseases such as diabetes, hypertension or infectious diseases before they become critical, as Namibia is experiencing increasing cases of chronic diseases such as diabetes and hypertension.

The installation of mobile containers equipped with medical devices can be an important step towards ensuring access to care in remote areas and improving prevention. We would be grateful for help if we could acquire such a mobile container with at least 2 General Practise's offices.

## Data protection information

The following information is provided on the basis of Article 13 of the GDPR<sup>1</sup>:
