Tomáš Tuláček



Tomáš Tuláček was born in Prague in a family of musicians. He started performing at the age of eight and as a member of a piano trio he appeared several times on Czech TV and represented Czechoslovakia in Germany and Poland. From 1970 to 1977 he studied at the Prague Conservatorie and continued at the Prague Music Academy. After graduation in 1981 he started his postgraduate studies in London, where he stayed during the next 25 years. He performed as soloist and then as concertmaster in the New chamber

orchestra of Oxford. These days he lives in Slovakia and works as a pedagogue and soloist. Last year he created together with his friends Ensemble Moscheles to promote music by Jewish composers from diaspora as well as from modern Israel.

Uri Brener



Uri Brener was born 1974 in Moscow and has been playing the piano since the age of four. His first compositional attempts go back to the age of seven, his first acclaimed opuses appeared at the age of 12. After studying and performing in Russia, Germany and Holland, he moved to Israel, where he got his PhD at the University of Bar-Ilan. He has written dozens of compositions in a wide variety of styles and genres, works for piano, chamber music, vocal, choral, symphonic opuses and crossover music. Uri has won a series of prestigious awards and scholarships, among them the 2006 Israel Prime Minister Prize for composition, an ACUM award, which he has been awarded three times (2008, 2010)

and 2015). Since 2007 Uri is active as a composer in residence of the Israeli Sinfonietta Orchestra and since 2016 he is a music director of the `Mikro` Theater in Jerusalem.

Israel - Czech Republic Friendship Association

In 1948, shortly after the establishment of the State of Israel Czech compatriots in Tel Aviv founded the Israel – Czechoslovakia Friendship League to assist by the development of bilateral relations. The League suspended its activities due to the interruption of diplomatic relations by the communist regime in Prague in 1967 and renewed them again in February 1990. After the dissolution of Czechoslovakia in



1993 it exist under the name Israel – Czech Republic Friendship Association. Nowadays only few of its members have roots in the Czech Republic, it is an Association of those who are in this or that way connected in bilateral relations in the field of business, culture, science or are friends of the Czech Republic.
