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#### The importance of the GI sector

- Over 900 PDO and PGIs registered at the EU level (does not include wines and spirits GIs)
- Annual turnover (wines and spirits excluded)
   according to a recent study published by the
   European Commission:
  - 14,2 billion € at producers' level
  - Over 21 billion € at retailers' level
- Between 3000 and 5000 GI wines and spirits produced in the EU

# The need to reform the EU quality policy

- Ongoing reform process: a good opportunity for producers to obtain the creation of a more positive and coherent EU legal framework for Gls
- GI Producers are calling for the creation of tools that will allow them to:
  - Better manage their sustainable development
  - Better protect their intellectual property rights

## GI Producers' position on the Commission's options

- Oppose the creation of a new quality logo
- Do not support the merge of the PDO and PGI concepts
- Could support the establishment of a single legal framework for all EU GIs (wines, spirits and other agricultural products) if specificities are maintained
- Welcome the Commission's proposal to clarify the use of GIs in the sales denomination of processed products when used as ingredients

#### GI Producers' specific demands

- Role of the organisation in charge of the GI should be clearly recognized to allow it to play a more active role in protecting the use of the GI beyond the production process
- The management of the production needed to allow GIs to continue to develop in a harmonious way and to prevent crisis
- A centralized approach for the management of the EU system is required but important to simplify the registration system to speed up the process

### The importance of the international dimension

#### GI producers call on the Commission to:

- Increase its efforts to promote a sui generis GI system (technical assistance to third countries)
- Secure positive results on GIs at the WTO (extension and multilateral register open to all products) and through bilateral negotiations
- Obtain that GIs are fully included in the scope of ACTA
- Work more closely with GI producers on these issues
