H.E. Petr Gandalovič, Ambassador of the Czech Republic to the United States, will open the event. Political Director **Pavel Fischer** and **Martins Zvaners** of the RFE/RL will introduce the Václav Havel Journalism Fellowship. The first Václav Havel Fellow, Belarusian journalist **Franak Viachorka**, will present the documentary *Lesson of Belarusian* (2006). Excerpts of the film will be screened at the event.

The Václav Havel Journalism Fellowship is a joint program between the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Czech Republic and RFE/RL. Inspired by the former president's belief in the power of words and recognizing the transformational role of journalism in challenging tyranny, it provides training and development opportunities at RFE/RL's Prague headquarters to journalists from countries where media freedom is stifled and independent journalists are at risk.

The event is part of the Embassy's project: Freedom of Expression in the Contemporary World, dedicated to Miloš Forman and Václav Havel, running from February-May 2012.

During the reception, guests may view a special exhibition celebrating the life of former President of the Czech Republic Václav Havel by leading Czech photographer Tomki Němec.
